CAMDEN CLIMATE ACTION PLAN 2020-2025

Climate Action Plan

- Climate Action Plan published in June 2020
- Actions for what the Council and community partners will deliver to tackle climate change
- Incorporates recommendations of Citizens' Assembly and findings of a technical evidence base
- Plan is structured around four key vision areas to support a zero carbon Camden
- Framework for climate action with Camden across citizens', organisations and the Council

People – "everyone in Camden will actively contribute to tackling the climate crisis"



Helping Somers Town residents tackle the climate emergency and create a fairer future for everyone







- Community empowerment / Community-led work
- Leadership from third sector organisations e.g Think & Do, Lifeafterhummus, PUNL
- Somers Town Future Neighbourhoods
- Supporting for schools including Dragon's Den and Sustainers Fest events

Organisations – "all organisations tackle the climate crisis through their operations"



- Supporting businesses through the Camden Climate Alliance – now over 400 members
- Camden Climate Pledge committing organisations to achieve net-zero by 2030
- Climate Connectors programme over £27,000 contributed by Camden businesses to support climate projects in schools/the community

Places – "Public spaces will enable sustainable travel choices and promote biodiversity"







- Increasing green spaces Fleet Valley Pocket Park, Alfred Place Park, Savernake Rd, Princes Circus
- 1718 trees planted since the CAP launched
- Low carbon transport:
 - 563 Electric Vehicle charge points installed
 - 313 cycle hangers installed
- 34 Healthy School Streets

Buildings – "Camden's buildings will be energy efficient and fit for the future"









- 200 Solar Panels installed on Talacre Sports Centre – further retrofit works are planned for later in 2024-25
- Deep retr in 2022
- Retrofit programme for Council Homes launched
 two major projects at 5-7 Belsize Grove and
 Brookes Court
- Over £68,000 awarded through the Camden
 Climate Fund since 2021 to help residents,
 businesses and schools reduce emissions from
 buildings



Deep retrofit of Swiss Cottage Library completed

Issues and limitations

- Limited corporate / business voice due to Citizen Assembly approach.
- Limited engagement with Camden youth including representing their voice in the Plan (43% of Camden under the age of 30).
- Consumption emissions in particular, not targeting higher earning consumers who contribute more emissions.
- Complexity of the housing systems resulting in difficulty to progress retrofit schemes.
